SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1) EVENT TITLE, DATE & VENUE

The Event shall be known as the MSW Collie Icebreaker Race & Regularity Meeting to be held on Saturday 3 March 2018 and Sunday 4 March 2018 at the Collie Motorplex, Powerhouse Road, Collie Western Australia.

2) ORGANISATION AND STATUS

- (a) The Event shall be held under the International Sporting Code of the Federation Internationale de l'automobile (FIA), the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd (CAMS), 2018 WA Historic Race Regularity Hillclimb and Sprint Regulations, 2018 CAMS WA Motor Race Championship Regulations, the Race Meeting Standing Regulations, the Speed Event Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations, Bulletins, and Instructions that may be issued.
- (b) This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the CAMS website at www.cams.com.au
- (c) Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by CAMS in relation to the Event. Further details can be found in the CAMS Insurance Handbook, available at www.cams.com.au.
- (d) The Event shall be a State Race and Regularity Event, with a stand-alone Super Sprint.

4) ENTRIES

- (i) **Opening date:** On publication of these Regulations
- (ii) **Closing date:** Wednesday 28th February 2018
- (iii) **Entry Fee for Racing:** \$200.00 (GST inc) + \$25.00 per Dorian
Entry Fee for Regularity: \$140.00 (GST inc) + \$25.00 per Dorian
- (iv) **Entry lodgement address:** admin@motoringsouthwest.org.au or PO Box 866, Collie, WA, 6225
- (v) **Refunds:** No monies will be refunded after the Monday prior to the Event
- (vi) **Restricted Entries:** The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason, in accordance with NCR 83.
- (vii) **Number of Entries:** There may be a minimum number of 80 Racing entries and 40 Regularity entries. The maximum number of entries is 200 accepted in order of receipt.
- (viii) **Event cancellation:** Event Organisers reserve the right to cancel, abandon or postpone the event in accordance with NCR 59 of the current CAMS Manual. Should the event be cancelled due to circumstances beyond our control, MSW reserves the right to withhold a percentage of the refund to cover costs.
- (ix) **Vehicle Eligibility:** The Regularity will be conducted for vehicles of CAMS Groups **A, C, F, J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S, T, U, V**, as outlined in the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, together with invited cars of compatible type. Vehicles may be CAMS log booked.

The Racing will be conducted for CAMS Log-booked cars from Hyundai Excel, Saloon, Historic Touring Car, Formula Vee, and Formula Classic (Formula Libre) classes.

5) MEMBERSHIP

All nominated Drivers must be a member of a CAMS-affiliated Club. Temporary membership of MSW is available to new members only and only available once per year.

The consent of a parent or guardian must appear on the Entry Form for any Driver under 18 years of age.

6) LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

- All Race Drivers must hold at a minimum of a CAMS Provisional Clubman Circuit Licence. Provisional licences will be held and can be collected from the Race Control at the conclusion of the Meeting. All Drivers holding Provisional licences must have displayed a 'P' plate on the rear of their vehicle in accordance with Schedule K. Those who do not may be penalised by the Stewards.
- Drivers in the Regularity and Super Sprint must hold a minimum of a CAMS Speed (previously known as L2S) Licence.

7) EVENTS

The Event program will be issued closer to the event, however there will be a minimum of 1 practice, 1 qualifying session and 3 competitive events for Racing classes, 1 practice, 1 qualifying session and 3 competitive events for Regularity classes and 1 practice session and 3 competitive events for Super Sprint classes.

8) SCRUTINY and DOCUMENT CHECK

All Entrants must present their vehicle and logbook (if issued) for Scrutiny, all vehicles must be adequately muffled, and all vehicles entered in Regularity must be equipped with a suitable fire extinguisher.

Any vehicle entered for Regularity Events (only) that has a CAMS logbook and complies with current Targeted Scrutiny Regulations will be required to present for an abbreviated Scrutiny of Driver apparel, paper work, and a brief safety check (including fire extinguisher) at the Scrutineering Bay.

Any vehicle not complying with the Audit requirements under Targeted Scrutiny Regulations must be presented for Scrutiny at a time and place specified in the Supplementary Regulations for that Event.

Scrutineering will occur Saturday 3rd March and Sunday 4th March from 0730 – 0830 in the Scrutineering Bay of the Collie Circuit.

At Scrutiny your helmet must be presented for inspection and approval. Your CAMS Licence, CAMS affiliated car club membership, and logbook (if applicable) must be produced at Scrutiny and on request during the Meeting.

9) DRIVERS' BRIEFING and SIGN ON

All Drivers competing at this Event must attend a **compulsory Drivers' Briefing and Sign-on where they will receive their wrist bands** on Saturday at 09:30am for all Drivers and Sunday 09:30am for any Drivers who did not compete on Saturday in the Clubroom.

Failure to attend the Briefing may result in exclusion from participation at the Meeting.

10) FIRST TIME DRIVERS AT THIS EVENT

First Time Drivers must report to the Clerk of Course after the Drivers' Briefing and may be taken for a familiarisation lap at slow speed behind the pace car.

11) PRACTICE/START TIMES:

Entrants will, as directed by the Clerk of the Course or an Official take part in Qualifying or Practice which are scheduled to start from 0900 hrs. Refer Icebreaker program for approximate times.

The Organisers utilise an automatic timing system that requires all cars to be fitted with a Dorian Data-1 transmitter, which is the Competitor's responsibility for all practice, qualifying and races.

- (a) **Qualifying is required by all Race Drivers, and Practice for all Regularity Drivers. In the case of Regularity Drivers, should you find that for exceptional reasons that you are unable to practice you**

must see the Clerk of the Course and present your case. You are not permitted to re-nominate a time unless you have had approval to do so by the Clerk of the Course

- (b) The Competition events are scheduled to start at 1145 hrs on Saturday and at 0900 hrs on Sunday.

12) STARTING POSITIONS

The starting order / grid positions, for Regularity and Super Sprint events will be directed by Grid Marshals.

- (a) **Race Events:** Unless stated within these Regulations, any Further Regulations, 2018 WA Motor Race Championship Regulations or 2018 WA Historic Race Regularity Hillclimb and Sprint Regulations, all starts will be standing starts.

(b) **Rolling Start Procedure (for all Regularity and Super Sprints):**

Competitors will assemble on the Dummy Grid area in the starting order as advised by Grid Marshals. Upon direction, the cars will enter Circuit in single file for a warm-up lap, which overtaking is prohibited. The pole position Driver is to keep the field moving slowly, and you will approach the start finish line in single file. **Your Event does not start until you cross the Start/Finish line.** The Events are rolling starts, **NOT** flying starts. There is to be **NO** overtaking until your vehicle has crossed the start line.

Any Competitor deemed to be in breach of this procedure may be charged by the Clerk of the Course and an appropriate penalty applied by the Stewards.

(c) **Determination:**

Drivers are reminded that this is a Regularity Trial and or Super Sprint and not a race.

Drivers not contesting the events in the appropriate manner may be black-flagged and may face further charges, as determined by the Stewards of the Meeting.

After practice you are to nominate your lap time to the Chief Timekeeper, should you wish to change it you must confer with the Clerk of the Course and Stewards to seek approval.

During practice new Drivers are not to pass any car unless absolutely necessary or safe to do so.

13) REFUELING

Competitors should note that there is no fuel for sale at the venue. There will be no refuelling allowed unless the ignition is switched off, there is an assistant standing by with a fire extinguisher and the Competitor is outside the vehicle. Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual.

14) DANGEROUS DRIVERS AND VEHICLES:

The Clerk of the Course may, at his sole discretion, prohibit from further competition at this meeting any Competitor who, in his opinion

- (i) exceeds 15kph in the paddock area,
- (ii) Continually leaves the bitumen while competing **or** who rejoins the race, in a manner which could cause damage to the edge of the Circuit, or at an unsafe speed,
- (iii) Any Driver who drives in a manner not consistent with the spirit of the meeting.
- (iv) Any Driver who does a "burn-out" or "donut".

15) PENALTIES:

Amongst others, the following offences may entail a time penalty by the addition of at least a "5" second up to a "60" second penalty to the time taken by him to complete the course without prejudice to such further penalty as the Stewards of the Meeting may determine having regard to the circumstances.

- a) False start,
- b) "Practice" start during the formation lap,
- c) Wrong occupation of an empty starting grid position,
- d) Changing of the starting position during the formation lap after the Safety Car has pulled into the Pit Lane,
- e) Overtaking before the signal to start has been given,

16) RESULTS & PROTESTS

Provisional Times and Results will be displayed on the notice board near the 'Sign-On' area as soon as possible after each Event. Copies of provisional results will be available on the day or Natsoft. Confirmed results may be published in the participating Club's newsletters and web-sites. Protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the NCR.

17) AWARDS

Trophies &/or certificates will be presented at a time and place to be further advised.

18) NON-COMPETITION VEHICLES:

- (i) Vehicles used for camping must be located in the designated Camping Area Only.
- (ii) All Competitor trailers and tow cars must be moved to the Designated Parking Area as soon as possible after unloading. Any Spectator car must be parked in a Designated Carpark.
- (iii) Loading or unloading of trailers in the Pit/Paddock Area from the beginning to the end of the day's competition is prohibited unless specifically directed by the Clerk of the Course.

19) ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND OTHER SUBSTANCES

Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.

20) CATERING

The canteen will be available both Saturday and Sunday from 7.00am to approx. 3.00pm.

21) CAMPING

Collie has a range of Motels to choose from and also camping is encouraged at the Circuit on the Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights ***but your intention to stay over must be advised prior to the Friday.*** Limited bunk room accommodation is available – this requires to be 'booked'.

Camping Fees are compulsory to assist with water, gas, electricity and cleaning costs:

Camp Site: \$10.00 per person for the first night then \$5.00 per extra night
Bunkhouse: \$15.00 per person for the first night then \$5.00 per extra night

Camping in the designated camping area is UNPOWERED and use of extension leads is NOT permitted – generators are ok.
