## **SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS**

### ***A Round of the 2014 W.A. Historic Regularity Drivers Championship***

#### **1) EVENT TITLE, DATE & VENUE**

The event shall be known as the Northam Flying 50 "Round-the-Houses" re-enactment to be held on Sunday 6th April 2014 in the town of Northam.

#### **2) ORGANISATION AND STATUS**

- (a) The event shall be held under the International Sporting Code of the Federation Internationale de l'automobile (FIA), the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd (CAMS), 5<sup>th</sup> Category – Historic Cars article 2.3 of the current CAMS Manual, the 2014 W.A. Historic Regularity Drivers Championship Standing Regulations, The Vintage Sports Car Club of WA (VSCC) 2014 Standing Regulations, (If you require a copy of the VSCC Standing Regulations Please contact the Entries Registrar or go to the VSCCWA web site), the CAMS Passenger in Vehicle Guidelines, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations and instructions to competitors that may be issued.
- (b) This event will be conducted under and in accordance with the CAMS Risk Management and Occupational Health and Safety Policies. These policies and the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport can be found at [www.cams.com.au](http://www.cams.com.au). Insurance is provided as per Appendix I of the current CAMS Manual.
- (c) The event shall be a Multi-Club Regularity event.

#### **4) ENTRIES**

- (i) **Opening date:** On publication of these Regulations
- (ii) **Closing date:** Friday 7<sup>th</sup> March 2014
- (iii) **Entry fee for Round-the-Houses per car:** \$198.00 (inc G.S.T.) + \$20.00 per Dorian payable to the VSCC of WA.
- (iv) **Entry lodgement address:** VSCCWA Entries, PO Box 1097 HILLARYS WA 6923
- (v) **Refunds:** No monies will be refunded after the Monday prior to the event
- (vi) **Restricted Entries:** The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason, in accordance with NCR 83
- (vii) **Number of Entries:** There will be a minimum number of 90 entries, for the event to be financially viable. The maximum number of entries is 200 (including Demonstrations), accepted in order of receipt.
- (viii) **Event cancellation:** Should the event be cancelled due to circumstances beyond our control, the club reserves the right to withhold a percentage of the refund to cover costs.
- (viii) **Vehicle Eligibility:** The Regularity will be conducted for vehicles complying with the regulations for 5th Category Historic Cars Groups **A, C, F, J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S, T, U, V**, as outlined in the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport. Additionally, the inclusion of other cars is permitted, subject to the Event Organiser having reached agreement with the CAMS State Manager and the local Historic Commissioner or Historic Eligibility Officer  
Vehicles should be either CAMS or VSCC log booked.
- (ix) All entries must include a copy of the vehicle log book (CAMS or in the case of a non-log booked car a VSCC of WA) displaying the vehicle category, Class log book number, latest audit date and most recent scrutiny history. If no log book has been issued and no competition history is available, then a completed copy of a log book application must accompany the entry. Log Book applications are available at [WWW.VSCCWA.COM.AU](http://WWW.VSCCWA.COM.AU) follow the link to documents.

## 5) MEMBERSHIP

All nominated drivers must be a member of a CAMS-affiliated Club. Temporary membership of the VSCCWA is available to new members only and only available once per year.

## 6) LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

Competitors must hold the minimum of a CAMS Level 2S or 2SJ licence. Competitors may obtain a CAMS Level 2SE licence from the CAMS office; however, this licence is only valid for one event in a twelve-month period.

## 7) EVENTS

The Organising Committee will group cars into appropriate categories at the closure of entries.

## 8) SCRUTINY and DOCUMENT CHECK

All entrants must present for scrutiny, and all vehicles must be adequately muffled.

### (i) City Competitors

Scrutiny will be held on **Saturday 29th March 2014** between 0800 and 1100 hrs.

**Venue:** Department of Transport, Licensing Centre, 21 Murray Road South, Welshpool

**If a city competitor is unable to make scrutiny on the 29th March, and fails to make an arrangement with the Chief Scrutineer, there may be a \$50.00 late fee to be paid to take part in country scrutiny.**

### (ii) Country Competitors:

**Albany & Bunbury Entrants: Saturday 29th March 2014** or as advised, at local venue (to be advised)  
**or**

Scrutiny will be held on Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> April from 0800 to 1200 hrs in the paddock at the Mt Ommanney Hill-climb,

**or**

Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> April from 07:30 – 08:30 in the paddock area in Minson Ave for those unable to present any earlier.

**Motokhana-only scrutiny is not acceptable for Regularity.**

At scrutiny your helmet must be presented for inspection and approval. Your CAMS Licence and log book (if applicable) and proof of CAMS-affiliated Club Membership must be produced at scrutiny and on request during the meeting.

**(iii)** All vehicles entered for VSCCWA Events including Sprints and Hillclimbs are subject to scrutiny. Any vehicle entered for Regularity Events (only) that has a CAMS logbook and complies with current Targeted Scrutiny Regulations will be required to present for an abbreviated scrutiny of driver apparel, paper work, and a brief safety check (including fire extinguisher) at the nominated scrutineering venue or at the venue on the day of the event.

Any vehicle not complying with the Audit requirements under Targeted Scrutiny Regulations must be presented for scrutiny at the time and place specified.

## 9) DRIVERS' BRIEFING and SIGN ON

All drivers must attend **the compulsory Drivers' Briefing at 0845 hrs on Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> April 2014** at the paddock/assembly area, near the commentary caravan. All drivers **must then meet with their assigned Group Leader, sign on**, then receive their neck tags from their Group Leader. Your neck tag will indicate the events you are in, your Grid Positions and your allocated Lap Time.

**Failure to attend the briefing may result in exclusion from participation at the meeting.**

## 10) FIRST TIME DRIVERS AT THIS EVENT

First Time drivers must attend a drivers briefing at 0910 hrs and will be taken for a familiarisation lap in a bus. Failure to attend this briefing may result in exclusion from participation at the meeting and/or further penalties as may be decided by the Stewards.

## 11) PASSES

Each competitor shall receive two admission tickets to gain entry to the paddock area. Any additional admission tickets can be pre purchased for \$5.50 per person with your entry, or on the day at the venue at a cost of \$10 per person.

## 12) PRACTICE/START TIMES:

Entrants will, as directed by the Clerk of the Course, take part in practice on **Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> April 2014, scheduled to start at 1000 hrs.**

- (a) Practice is required by all drivers, however should you find that for exceptional reasons that you are unable to practice you must see your Group Leader/Clerk of the Course and present your case. You are not permitted to re-nominate a time unless you have had approval to do so by your Group Leader/Clerk of the Course
- (b) The event proper is scheduled to start at 11.30 hrs.

### 13) STARTING POSITIONS

The starting order / grid positions, for your events will be listed on your neck tag that you will receive after the drivers briefing or as otherwise directed by Grid Marshals.

#### (a) Start Procedure:

Competitors will be assembled in the dummy grid area in the order as shown on your neck tag. Upon direction, the cars will enter circuit for a warm-up lap behind the Safety car during which overtaking is prohibited. In practice and for each event a Safety Car will lead the field out from the dummy grid and the last car will be followed by a Sweep Car.

You must at all times keep the field bunched up. At a pre determined position on the track the Safety and Sweep Cars will confer and if the field is **not** tight enough you will do another lap until such time as the field is set to compete. (This will result in a timed lap of your Regularity event being docked)

The safety car will quicken its pace to exit the circuit at the Pit Entry; **THIS IS NOT THE SIGNAL TO START THE EVENT**. The pole position driver is to keep the field moving slowly, bunched up with all drivers maintaining a 2 x 2 formation. You will approach the start finish line 2 x 2 (even going around the corner) **Your event does not start until you cross the Start/Finish line**. The events are rolling starts, **NOT** flying starts. You must at all times keep the field closed up, and there must be no passing until you have crossed the start line.

Any competitor deemed to be in breach of this procedure may be charged by the Clerk of the Course and an appropriate penalty applied by the Stewards.

#### b) Determination:

Entrants are asked to nominate a lap-time on the Entry Form. This time will be used with times from historical data to allocate a lap-time which will be printed on your neck tag. These allocated times will be based on dry conditions, and should the track be classed as wet an appropriate extra time, as advised by the Clerk of Course, will be added to all allocated times.

New drivers with no available time will be allocated a time placing them at, or near, the rear of the field. They **must** abide by this time and are not to pass any car unless absolutely necessary and safe to do so. We need to observe new drivers and they need to understand how the event is run.

The allocated time will also be used in practice. After practice you are to look at your time and if you wish to change it you must confer with your Group Leader who will in turn confer with the Clerk of the Course and Stewards to seek approval. **Drivers are reminded that this is a Regularity Trial and not a race.**

Drivers not contesting the events in the appropriate manner may be black-flagged and may face further charges, as determined by the Stewards of the Meeting.

#### c) Flags:

Competitors must be familiar with flag signals. There must be an immediate and significant reduction in speed when the yellow and red flags are displayed, and no passing is permitted while these flags are in use. Any breach may result in immediate exclusion and/or further penalties may be imposed by the Stewards.

### 14) REFUELING

There will be a designated refuelling area where all fuel containers are to be kept. There will be no refuelling allowed unless you're in this refuelling area, the ignition is switched off, there is an assistant standing by with a fire extinguisher and the competitor is outside the vehicle. Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual.

### 15) PARADE

Parades may be held on Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> April 2014 after practice concludes, or during a lunch break, for invited cars only. This will be in accordance with NCR 20a. The cars will run in a group behind the Safety Car. A Sweep Car will follow the field. The Parade will be conducted at a speed of less than 50km/hr. Only nominated drivers for the car will be able to drive in the Parade. There will be no timing of the Parade and overtaking is strictly forbidden. Cars must remain in their starting formation at all times and drivers must remain within two car lengths of the car in front and not allow a space to open up between cars.

ALL passengers MUST sign a "Passengers in Vehicle Disclaimer". In the case of those passengers under the age of 18, the parent or guardian must have signed the disclaimer allowing participation, prior to the participant entering the vehicle. All invited participants must sign-on as a participant at a briefing to be held at the Car Club Display area. You will be issued a pass allowing entry to the course, only on completion of disclaimer. Invited participants must attend a briefing at 9.45am in the Car Club Display area.

**Passengers under the age of 12 are not permitted.**

**All persons must be adequately restrained and conform to NCR 20A.**

## 16) DEMONSTRATIONS

A number of cars maybe invited to run in up to 2 demonstrations, which will be held on Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> April 2014 at a time indicated in the program.

The cars will run in a group behind the Safety Car. A Sweep Car will follow the field. The demonstration will be conducted at a speed of less than 90km/hr

Drivers for the Demonstration must have a CAMS L2 licence at least, conform to NCR 20B, and attend A Drivers Briefing at 10.45is at a location to be advised to participants.

Passengers are only permitted in vehicles if the following conditions are complied with:

1. All passengers, including those who have signed an entry form, must sign the appropriate Passenger in Vehicle Indemnity Form. Personal Accident Insurance is **not** available for passengers. A verbal warning that accidents can and often do happen and that motor sport is dangerous must be given at the time the indemnity is signed. The passenger must verbally acknowledge: that accidents may happen; that they appreciate the possible extent of injuries; and that they appreciate the likelihood and nature of these injuries.
2. Passengers and drivers **MUST** wear protective clothing as in Schedule D of the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport - Apparel for Races, Speed Events, and Rallies & Off Road (as appropriate)
3. The vehicle is driven by a person holding both a CAMS and Civil drivers licence.
4. All vehicles must comply with the relevant discipline Standing Regulations and be fitted with all appropriate safety equipment including seats, and harness which must be worn at all times by the passenger while in the car.
5. Persons under the age of 12 **MAY NOT BE PASSENGERS**. Persons under the age of 14 years may not be passengers in a vehicle if their parent or legal guardian is the driver of the vehicle. Persons under the age of 18 years may be passengers only at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course. In all cases, for passengers under the age of 18, a parent or legal guardian must sign the appropriate disclaimer. The minimum age for a passenger shall be no less than the minimum age for a driver in the event.
6. No competition driving may take place. The vehicle **must** be kept to significantly **less** than competition speeds.
7. The number of vehicles in a Demonstration must not exceed maximum track density for that class of vehicle on that course as prescribed on the Track Licence or as otherwise notified by CAMS.
8. All vehicles in a Demonstration must have undergone appropriate scrutiny.

## 17) RESULTS

For each lap on which the competitor records a lap time less than his nominated time, a penalty of two points per 0.01 second shall apply. For each lap greater than his nominated lap time, a penalty of one point per 0.01 second shall apply. The winner is the competitor who has completed the required number of laps and has accrued the least penalty points.

Protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the NCR. The Clerk of the Course shall be the Judge of Fact for the event.

## 18) AWARDS

Trophies &/or certificates for 1st place in each of the day's events will be presented after course clean-up at the conclusion of competition. The venue will be either The Shamrock Hotel Beer Garden or Bernard Park. Those trophies not presented on the day will be available at the next club meeting

## 19) POSTPONEMENT, ABANDONMENT, CANCELLATION

The organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the event in accordance with NCR 59.
