



Become a Member

There are various categories for Membership within the Vintage Sports Car Club of WA Inc.

Full Membership **\$115**

Full membership entitles the member to enter all VSCC events, have full voting rights and receive a newsletter.

Once off nomination fee of \$50.00 is payable.

There is a Pensioner Discount of \$20.00 for holders of a Pensioner Concession or State Concession card. A Seniors Card does not qualify.

Associate Membership **\$30**

Associate membership is available to a spouse or partner of a Full Member. An associate member is entitled to enter all VSCC events but without voting rights and will not receive a newsletter.

Family Membership **\$11**

Family membership is available to a member's family under the age of 21 and not employed. A family member is entitled to enter all VSCC events but does not have voting rights and will not receive a newsletter.

The membership fees listed above are for the 2007/2008 membership year. All memberships expire on June 30th each year.

If you join after April 1st, your membership will expire on June 30th, the following year.

Vintage Sports Car Club of WA (Inc.)



Officially formed in August 1986 when some 50 motoring enthusiasts met to establish the objectives for the club, the VSCC is today the largest historic vehicle club in Western Australia.

These objectives were "the organisation of events to cater for older sports and racing cars and to especially celebrate the original 'round the houses' racing which was held on street circuits in many country towns in the 30's, 40's and 50's". These objectives remain unchanged today.

The first 'round the houses' event was held in Albany in 1936 with subsequent events held in Bunbury, Collie, Geraldton, Goomalling, Northam, Pingelly and Toodyay. There was even an Australian Grand Prix held in Narrogin in 1951 to celebrate the Jubilee of Australia.

The 'York Flying Fifty' was a regular fixture on the club calendar for many years and was instrumental in bringing out of hiding numerous historic vehicles that had not been seen for many years.

The VSCC has successfully managed and run more than 30 'round the houses' re-enactment events in Albany, Northam, Narrogin, York and Midland. In addition to 'round the houses' events the club hold regularity trials at Barbagallo Raceway and the Collie Motorplex and also run a competitive hill climb series.

The club's event calendar is complimented by a number of social events throughout the year. These events allow members the opportunity to get their classic, vintage or even modern cars out for a social run with other enthusiasts.

The VSCC typically runs a variety of events throughout the year. These are two 'round the houses' style events, two circuit events, several Hill Climbs plus various social events.

Caversham, which has not been used since the early 70s is being reinvigorated by the VSCC. With the circuit's history in WA as the major venue for racing through the 50-70s, it is hoped that it can be used to hold a regular annual event. The famous circuit will become the venue for some re-enactments like the '57 and '62 Grand Prix.

The Collie Crown is run over two days in conjunction with the Historic Competition Motorcycle Club of WA at the Collie Motorplex in spring. Historic motor vehicles and historic motorcycles compete for the Collie Crown over two competitive days with practice, qualifying and regularity generally run on Saturday and regularity and racing on Sunday.

The Vintage Stampede is the final major competitive event organised by the club each year. The event is typically held on the last weekend in November and gives members the opportunity to compete on a full race circuit at Barbagallo Raceway in historic or modern vehicles.

The Albany Classic is traditionally held over the June long weekend each year. The event takes place over two days with a hill climb at Mt Clarence on Saturday and the 'round the houses' re-enactment on Sunday.

The Northam Flying Fifty is a two-day event and is traditionally held in April each year. The event encompasses a hill climb at Mt Ommanney on Saturday with the 'round the houses' re-enactment on Sunday.



The VSCC manages a competitive hill climb championship with venues varying from year to year.

The club's competitive event calendar is complimented with a number of social events throughout the year. These non-competitive events provide members with an opportunity to take their classic or even day-to-day cars out for a social run and meet with other members.

General club meetings are held on the first Monday of each month (except January) at the Jaguar Car Club at 396 Scarborough Beach Road, Osborne Park commencing at 8pm. Meetings are generally well attended providing the opportunity for members to keep up to date with club business and share their vast knowledge of the sport and its cars with other like minded enthusiasts.
