SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1) EVENT TITLE, DATE & VENUE

The event shall be known as the Bendigo Bank Northam Flying 50 "Round-the-Houses" re-enactment to be held on Sunday 5th April 2020 in the Town of Northam, Western Australia

2) ORGANISATION AND STATUS

- a. The event shall be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Motorsport Australia (formerly CAMS), 5th Category – Historic Cars group regulations, the Vintage Sports Car Club of WA (VSCC) 2020 Standing Regulations, the 2020 Motorsport Australia WA Regularity Championship regulations, the Motorsport Australia Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) Policy, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations and instructions to competitors that may be issued.
- b. This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Motorsport Australia Safety 1st and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the website at www.motorsport.org.au.
- c. The event shall be a **State Regularity Championship**.

3) INSURANCE

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au.

5) ENTRIES

- a. **Opening date:** On publication of these Regulations
- b. **Closing date:** Friday 20th March 2020
- c. **Entry fee per car** (inc GST): \$260 (\$50 discount for VSCC & SCBC members) + \$25 per dorian payable to the VSCCWA.
- d. **Entry lodgement:** **VSCCWA Entries, PO Box 7277 Spearwood WA or entries@vscw.com.au.**
- e. **Refunds:** No monies will be refunded for withdrawals after the Monday prior to the event
- f. **Restricted Entries:** The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason, in accordance with NCR 83. The entries will be restricted to Motorsport Australia 5th Category – Historic Cars group regulations due to track licence conditions.
- g. **Number of Entries:** There will be a minimum number of 90 entries, for the event to be financially viable. The maximum number of entries is 150, accepted in order of receipt.
- h. **Event cancellation:** Should the event be cancelled due to circumstances beyond our control, the club reserves the right to withhold a percentage of the refund to cover costs.
- i. **Vehicle Eligibility:** The Event will be conducted for vehicles complying with the regulations for 5th Category Historic Cars Groups **A, C, F, J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S, T, U, V**, as outlined in the current Motorsport Australia Manual of Motor Sport. Entries for vehicles which do not comply but "represent the 5th Category" may be accepted at the discretion of the Event Organiser. All vehicles included in Regularity events must comply, as a minimum, with Schedules A & B of the Motorsport Australia Manual – General Requirements.

6) LICENCE REQUIREMENTS

Competitors must hold the minimum of a Motorsport Australia Level 2S or 2SJ licence. Competitors may obtain a temporary Level 2 licence from the Motorsport Australia office or www.motorsport.org.au

7) MEMBERSHIP

All nominated drivers must be a member of a Motorsport Australia affiliated Club. You will be required to present your membership card at scrutineering.

8) EVENT PROGRAM

The Organising Committee will group cars into appropriate fields. Depending on entry numbers received, the program will consist of 5 fields with 1 practice and 4 competitive runs for each field. Timed events (number of minutes instead of number of laps) may be utilised, in which case all fields will be given the same time allocation. A preliminary program of Events will be provided with acceptance documentation.

9) SCRUTINY and DOCUMENT CHECK

All entrants must present their vehicle for scrutiny. In addition, your helmet and apparel, in compliance with Schedule D of the Motorsport Australia Manual, must be presented for inspection. Your Motorsport Australia Competition Licence, Club membership and log book (if applicable) must be produced at scrutiny and on request during the meeting. Entrants of race vehicles that comply with the Audit conditions of the Targeted Scrutiny Regulations must present a logbook to verify the vehicles audit status.

a. City Competitors:

Scrutiny will be held on **Saturday 21st March** between 8:00am and 11:00am at the North Metropolitan TAFE off Lloyd Street Midland (or as otherwise notified).

For competitors not attending scrutiny at Midland or country locations there will be a \$50.00 fee to attend an alternate scrutiny or at the venue.

b. Country Competitors:

Albany & Bunbury competitor's scrutiny will be held at a local venue to be advised or;

Country competitors' scrutiny will be held at the venue on from 7:30am.

c. Target Scrutiny:

Entrants of vehicles which comply with the audit conditions of the Targeted Scrutiny Regulations can have paperwork and apparel scrutinised at the venue from 7:30am or at the venues as above.

NOTE: Scrutiny at the Northam venue will only be for country competitors' and those unable to attend the designated scrutiny locations. Scrutiny is limited so prior notice for booking is essential.

10) DRIVERS' BRIEFING and SIGN ON

All drivers must attend **the compulsory Drivers' Briefing at 8:30 am** at the paddock/assembly area, near the commentary caravan. All drivers **must then meet with their assigned Group Leader, sign on** and receive instruction. Your team leader will provide documentation that indicates the events you are in, your Grid Positions and your practice starting position.

Failure to attend the briefing may result in exclusion from participation at the meeting.

11) FIRST TIME DRIVERS AT THIS EVENT

First time drivers must attend the drivers briefing at **9:00 am** and will be taken for a familiarisation lap. Failure to attend this briefing may result in exclusion from participation at the meeting and/or further penalties as may be decided by the Stewards. If you have not competed on this course, in this car, in the last three years, you should regard yourself as a first timer. Drivers with no competition history are required to attach a "P" plate to the rear of their car.

12) PRACTICE

Competitors will, as directed by the Clerk of the Course, take part in practice as scheduled in the event program. Practice is required by all drivers; if you are unable to practice you must see your Group Leader/Clerk of the Course and present your case.

13) DETERMINATION OF LAP TIMES

Competitors are requested to nominate a lap-time on the Entry Form to determine your practice grid position. The practice session lap times will be used to determine your allocated lap time. New drivers with no available time will be allocated a time placing them at, or near, the rear of the field. New drivers must abide by this time and are not to pass any car unless absolutely necessary and safe to do so.

For any subsequent change your allocated time you must confer with your Group Leader who will seek approval from the Clerk of the Course and Stewards.

A minimum lap time for the circuit will be nominated by the Organisers, Clerk of Course and Stewards at their discretion. Any driver exceeding the nominated minimum circuit lap time either during practice or in the Event, may be black flagged and may be excluded from the Event, and/or subject to further penalties.

14) START PROCEDURE

The starting order / grid positions for your events will be listed on your competitor documentation provided at drivers briefing, or as otherwise directed by Grid Marshals throughout the event.

Competitors will assemble in the dummy grid area in the pre-determined order and, upon direction from the marshals; the cars will enter circuit for a warm-up lap behind the Safety car during which overtaking is prohibited. In practice and for each event a Safety Car will lead the field out from the dummy grid and the last car will be followed by a Sweep Car.

The events are rolling starts, **NOT** flying starts. You must at all time keep the field closed up, and there must be no passing until you have crossed the start line.

Any competitor deemed to be in breach of this procedure may be charged by the Clerk of the Course and an appropriate penalty applied.

15) ELECTRONIC TIMING:

All vehicles will require a Dorian Data-1 timing transmitter to be fitted prior to the commencement of practice.

Competitors who have hired a transmitter will be issued one at the Timing Office. The mounting of the transmitter is the responsibility of the competitor. It is the responsibility of the competitor to cover any costs related to repairs and or replacement of the transmitter if lost or damaged. It is also the responsibility of the competitor to return the transmitter to the Timing Room at the end of your last event.

16) FLAGS

Competitors must be familiar with flag signals as advised at Driver's Briefing. There must be an immediate and significant reduction in speed when the yellow and red flags are displayed, and no passing is permitted while these flags are in use. Any breach may result in immediate exclusion from the event and/or further penalties may be imposed.

17) SINGLE FILE ZONES

There will be designated "Single File Zones" at the "Round the Houses" Historic Events. These areas will be identified by a prominent black-on-yellow "Single File Zone" sign. Any driver not adhering to the Motorsport Australia Code of Driving Conduct in these zones may be shown a black flag and may be excluded from the remainder of the Event, or charged under NCRs at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.

18) REFUELLING

Refuelling will be allowed in the Pits Area, however fuel containers should be stored in the designated area adjacent to the fire truck at the end of the dummy grid. **DO NOT REFUEL HOT VEHICLES.** Ensure the vehicle ignition is switched off, there is an assistant standing by with a fire extinguisher and the competitor is outside the vehicle. Fuel must be in accordance with Schedule G of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.

19) RESULTS

For each lap on which the competitor records a lap time less than his nominated time, a penalty of two points per 0.01 second shall apply. For each lap greater than his nominated lap time, a penalty of one point per 0.01 second shall apply. The winner is the competitor who has completed the required number of laps and has accrued the least penalty points.

Protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the NCR. The Clerk of the Course shall be the Judge of Fact for the event.

20) AWARDS

Trophies &/or certificates for highest points scored in each group/category will be presented at a time to be advised.

21) POSTPONEMENT, ABANDONMENT, CANCELLATION

The organiser reserves the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the event in accordance with NCR 59. Protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the current Motorsport Australia Manual.

22) USE OF PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

Any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Anti-Doping Policy and/or the Motorsport Australia Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the Motorsport Australia website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a Motorsport Australia 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a Motorsport Australia Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.
